Supporting a statewide bond for affordable housing

Resentencing, expungement, and clemency

To address systemic harms, legalization must include processes for clemency, resentencing, and expungement that are speedy, automatic, and free of cost.



Elimination of collateral consequences

The collateral consequences of a cannabis conviction can significantly derail a person's life, restricting their ability to secure employment, housing, and many public services. Rhode Island should ensure that no one continues to face the collateral consequences of a cannabis conviction.



Fair fines and fees

Rhode Island should forgive outstanding debts for cannabis fines and fees, which have harmed low-income communities and communities of color for decades.



Inclusive legal markets

Legalization must include equitable access to cannabis businesses and dispensaries, not just for the well-resourced, well-connected few.

Police Reform At a minimum, we need increased access and transparency if we expect accountability in law enforcement.



Enforcement of policy violations

From body camera usage or the use of force policy, police policies need to be enforced properly and LEOBOR needs to be fully repealed.
